How to Get from Madrid to the University

- **Train:** Take line C4 towards Parla, and get off at "Las Margaritas Universidad" station. The train can be taken from any of the following "cercanías" (commuter) train stations: *Chamartin – Clara Campamor* (28 minutes), *Nuevos Ministerios* (24 minutes), *Sol* (20 minutes), or *Atocha* (14 minutes). The ticket price is €1.70 (2 zones) and can be purchased directly from the machines at the station. Trains are frequent, running every 6 minutes during peak hours or every 10 minutes at other times. Trains run from approximately 5:30 am until midnight (<https://www.renfe.com/es/es/cercanias/cercanias-madrid/horarios>).
- **Bus:** From *Plaza Elíptica*, take buses 441 or 442. The ticket price is €1.30. The frequency ranges from every 9 minutes during peak hours to every 21 minutes during off-peak hours. The approximate duration is 20 minutes. The schedule is from approximately 6:30 am to 0:30 am

- **Taxi:** The "official" taxis in Madrid are white cars with a red stripe. You can hail one directly on the street by raising your hand or find one at a taxi stand. The approximate price to the Getafe Campus is €25-30. There are also Uber and Cabify services that cost approximately €20-25.

How to Get from the Airport to the University or Madrid

- **Train** (Terminal T4): There is a train station inside the airport. From here, take line C1 to reach Madrid and then switch to line C4 (see the previous section) to get to Getafe. You can take line C1 to *Chamartin-Clara Campamor*, *Nuevos Ministerios*, or *Atocha* and then switch to line C4. My recommendation is to change to line C4 at *Nuevos Ministerios* station. The ticket price is €2.40 and can be purchased directly from the machines at the station. Trains run every 15-20 minutes. The schedule is from approximately 6:30 am until midnight (<https://www.renfe.com/es/es/cercanias/cercanias-madrid/horarios>). From terminals T1, T2, and T3, you can take a bus to get to T4 (<https://www.aeropuertomadrid-barajas.com/transportes/bus-transito-lanzadera-terminales.html#gsc.tab=0>).
- **Metro** (T1, T2, T3, and T4): Line 8 (pink) goes to the center of Madrid (*Nuevos Ministerios* station, 22-28 minutes) and from there you can take other metro lines to other places in Madrid or the train to Getafe. The price is €1.50, with an additional airport supplement of €3.00. To buy a ticket, you need to have a reusable card ("*Tarjeta Multi*") which costs €2.50 and can be used for adding other metro or bus trips in central Madrid. This card can be purchased and recharged at metro stations.
- **Taxi:** The "official" taxis in Madrid, white cars with a red stripe, can be found at the exit of any terminal. The price to the center of Madrid is regulated and costs €30. The approximate price to the Getafe Campus is €70-90. There are also Uber and Cabify services that cost approximately €30-50.
